#### **PROPERTY AND BUSINESS ASSESSMENT NOTICES**

#### **Alderman Dale Hodges**

On January 3, 2012, The City mailed 2012 Property and Business Assessment Notices. The 60-day Customer Review Period, which started on January 3, is your opportunity and timeframe to review your Notice. Please read over your 2012 Assessment Notice carefully. The City offers a number of online tools and resources to help you understand and review your assessment for fairness and equity. When reviewing your assessment:

- Check: Is the factual information which the City has on record correct?
- Review: Is your property and/or business assessment a reasonable estimate as of July 01, 2011, of the market value of your property, or typical net annual rental value of your business premises, as of that date?
- Compare: Is your assessment equitable when compared with similar properties or business premises?

The City's newly redesigned Assessment Search website – calgary.ca/assessmentsearch, will provide 2012 property and business assessment information.

Assessment Search – calgary.ca/assessmentsearch, will provide the resources you need to conduct your assessment review. Assessment Search offers more information, enhanced search capabilities, a secure environment for your information and new account management features.

By selecting the new secure login service for Calgary property owners, you can conduct more in-depth assessment research, using real estate market information, summary assessment information of other

properties and more detailed information about your own property (viewable only by you – the property owner). A similar secure login service is available for business owners, which was introduced in May 2011. Secure Login – getting started

Information on how to login and use Assessment Search will be provided on your 2012 Assessment Notice and on calgary.ca/assessmentsearch. Also available online is "How-to" information which offers step-by-step details to complete an online assessment review.

**Complaint Process** 

If you have endeavoured to sort out any issues with the Assessment Department, but have been unsuccessful, you must file a complaint prior to March 5, 2012. You will be scheduled for a hearing before a panel of the Board. In advance of the hearing, you will need to submit evidence and arguments to support your position. The Assessment Business Unit will also submit evidence, to which you will have a chance to respond in writing. The Board will use the evidence before it determines whether to uphold the existing assessment or vary it. # NORTH WEST LRT EXTENSION TO ROCKY RIDGE, ROYAL OAK AND TUSCANY CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE (2012—2012)

On November 29, 2011, City council approved the 2012-2014 Transportations business plan and budget which included this project. A civil works contract (underground utilities, storm sewer upgrades and earthworks) was awarded in November 2011, and construction in the median of Crowchild Trail (the future track bed) is underway to prepare the site for station and track construction. The contract for the station, bus terminals and Park & Ride construction will be tendered early in the new year for a spring 2012 start.

Contractors are required to water the sites during construction to control dust. Construction traffic will be expected in the adjacent communities, but every effort will be made to minimize impacts to residents whenever

possible. Public art will be incorporated in the station facilities.

During the past four years, many meetings, newsletters and five open houses were completed to ensure we had public consultation on this project.

#### STATION HIGHLIGHTS

This station will primarily serve those living and working in Rocky Ridge, Royal Oak and Tuscany. The project includes:

A new C Train station in the median of Crowchild Trail

#### **NORTH WEST LRT**

- Two Park & Ride lots in Rocky Ridge/Royal Oak and Tuscany, with total capacity for approximately 550 passenger vehicles
- Bus terminals in each of the Park & Ride lots, with five new bus routes when the station opens – three in Rocky Ridge/Royal Oak and two in Tuscany
- A pedestrian bridge linking the bus terminal and Park & Ride facilities with the LRT station and connecting the regional pathway across Crowchild Trail
- Two LRT bridges at the Stoney Trail interchange
- Two electrical substation buildings
- 2.5 km of track





#### Neighbour to Neighbour — Backyard Fire Pits

It is hard to believe spring is around the corner! With the excitement of spring comes the planning of many yard projects. If you have an existing fire pit or are considering installing one in your back yard, please review the Community Standards Bylaw regarding fire pits. Failure to comply with the bylaw could result in fines ranging from \$500 to \$5,000. The term "fire pit" refers to both permanent and portable outdoor fire receptacles.

#### All fires must be:

- In a fire pit or receptacle constructed of non-combustible material.
- In a fire pit built into the bare ground or set upon non-combustible material such as brick or stone (if not in a receptacle).
- Not within two meters of the property line, building or fence, or beneath any trees or branches (or other combustible materials).
- Kept to a reasonable size (under 1 metre both height and width) so the fire, embers, sparks or dense smoke do not endanger anyone or cause a nuisance on any neighbouring properties.
- Fully supervised at all times and may be started beginning at 10 a.m.
- Fully extinguished by 1 a.m.
- You must have a means to extinguish the fire on hand at all times. The fire must be extinguished completely, so that the ashes are cold prior to leaving the fire.

#### **Backyard Fire Pits**

#### You cannot burn:

- Treated or painted lumber
- Lumber products containing glue or resin
- Wet or unseasoned wood
- Leaves, brush or yard waste
- Garbage
- Rubber, tires or plastic
- Animal carcasses or parts

#### Fire ban:

The fire chief has the power to declare a complete ban on all burning within the city. The Calgary Fire Department, the Calgary Police or a Peace Officer may ask you to extinguish your fire when a fire ban is in effect. They may also ask you to extinguish your fire if you are not complying with the regulations listed above.

#### Tips for fire pit use

Only clean, dry firewood is permitted to be burned in fire pits. Burning prohibited materials can cause dense smoke and offensive odours to neighbouring properties.

Smoke from fire pits can cause adverse health effects in some people. Be aware of neighbours that may be negatively impacted to exposure of smoke from outdoor fire pits.

Before using your fire pit, familiarize yourself with optimal wind conditions and take precautions to prevent smoke from disturbing your neighbours. High wind speeds may pose a fire hazard.

Low wind speeds may contribute to poor air quality and reduce smoke dissipation.

Placing a metal grill/screen on top of the fire pit reduces the flame's size and helps prevent sparks and embers from escaping and igniting nearby materials.
